IN-SCHOOL SUSPENSION

The Board of Education recognizes the importance of school attendance. Therefore, suspension from school must be viewed as a last resort in dealing with student disciplinary infractions. An alternate, preferable in many cases to full suspension, is inschool suspension, a condition in which the student is still required to maintain attendance at school but is suspended from attendance or participation in classes or activities.

The Board directs the Superintendent of Schools to develop an in-school suspension program. The program should provide appropriate supervision in the in-school suspension rooms and guidelines for the imposition of an in-school suspension.
